

THE 2024 MARCEL A. BEDARD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP AWARD FOR SERVICE

Sponsored by the MONTCLAIR LIONS CLUB of VIRGINIA

Eligibility: To qualify for this scholarship 12th grade students must be attending a High School (Public, Private or Home School) in Prince William County and live in the 22025/22026 zip code. Additionally, Seniors participating in the Montclair Leo Club are also eligible.

Introduction: The Montclair Lions award two different types of scholarships each year, one focused on leadership and academics, and a second focused on service. While these scholarships are similar in content and application process, each application requires its own subject specific essay. This Scholarship, The Marcel A. Bedard Memorial Scholarship, recognizes a high school senior preparing to pursue higher education who has demonstrated exemplary community service through their willingness to volunteer their time to others. The actual scholarship amount can vary based on funds raised during the year of award, but generally averages \$1000 per scholarship.

All applications must be submitted by Electronic (Digital) filing by 1 April 2024 to montclairlion246@gmail.com, and must be reviewed by the student's parent or guidance counselor for accuracy.

Selection Criteria: This scholarship will be awarded on the basis of the following criteria:

- Completeness of application and details provided.
- Demonstrated commitment to community through service hours provided to others as documented by a list of individuals and organizations served.
- Expressed understanding of 1) why community service is important, 2) who it benefits and 3) how it has affected or enriched the student, presented as a written essay.
- Demonstrated academic interests as documented via student transcripts.
- Recognition of services provided as documented by at least two letters of recommendation from adults involved in the service project(s) or event(s) supported.
- A statement provided by an adult that the data presented is accurate and true.
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History and Background: This specific scholarship is named after Marcel A. Bedard, a well-respected Lion and founding member of the Montclair Lions Club who passed in 2012.

One of Marcel's greatest joys in life was serving the community he had lived in for almost 50 years. During these years Marcel was a member of the Dale City Lions and then a Charter Member of the Montclair Lions. He was also a member of the Moose Lodge in Dale City, VA,

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the Elks Lodge in Woodbridge, VA, an AARP Deputy State Coordinator and Chief Training Officer, and a Boy Scout representative. Marcel received many awards and certificates over the years for his community services and received Citizen of the Year for Prince William County in 2005.

As a Lion, Marcel served in many capacities of leadership to include secretary, president, zone chairman, and various positions on the District Governor's Cabinet. As Montclair's Lion's Sight and Hearing program leader he was directly responsible for thousands of area children receiving sight and hearing screening as well as eyeglasses. It is this life of service to others which should serve as an inspiration to those seeking this award.

The Application Process: Students must send an "Intent to Apply" E-mail providing their name, the name of their high school or home school, and contact information for themselves and their school counselor. Please E-mail intent to: montclairlion246@gmail.com by **1 March 2024**.

Students must then compile and forward their application and all supporting materials by **1 April 2024 to the same Email address**. The application may be a combination of an E-mail and attachments, in MS Word, or PDF format, or a single combined file in either format.

The application must be coordinated with Parents or individual Guidance Counselors and include a signed statement that the data presented is accurate and true.

The scholarship winner will be determined by the Montclair Lions Club Scholarship Committee and ranked according to the Selection Criteria presented below. Top applicants may be interviewed by the Committee, if necessary.

Instructions:

- 1) The student must submit their intent to apply by 1 March 2024, and their full and complete application by 1 April 2024, to montclairlion246@gmail.com.
- 2) The student must document their service to the community around them by providing a resume/listing of the community service activities, projects, and events they have supported during high school. These efforts may be sponsored by their school, church, or the community at large. This resume/listing should describe the activities, the types of service provided, the approximate time spent participating in each, and the number of people who benefited. Please also include a name and telephone number of a contact person for each supported activity, if available.

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- 3) The student must compose and submit an original essay of not more than 400 words discussing some aspect of their community service experience. Specifically, they should document and explain; a) why providing community service at the high school level is important, b) who their service has benefited, c) how it has affected or enriched their life or the lives of those around them, and d) their plans for continuing to support their community through service in the future.
- 4) The student must document continued academic achievement concurrent with providing community service, as validated by a copy of their high school transcripts showing a cumulative grade point average of at least 2.5 on a 4 point scale. Please also include a list of any honors or distinctions received during high school.
- 5) The student must demonstrate plans for continuing their education as verified by at least one letter of acceptance to either a two or four year accredited higher education program, college, or university.
- 6) The student must provide copies of at least two letters of recommendation, preferably from an individual involved in some aspect of their community service involvement (e.g. faculty/advisor of a school club, community organization or church group). Alternatively, a letter of recommendation could be from someone who benefited from the student's involvement.

3. An original essay documenting the student's involvement and life lessons learned by participation in community service.
4. A copy of the student's High Schools transcripts documenting academic standing, plus a list of any Honors or Distinctions achieved in school, work and or service,
5. A minimum of two letters of recommendation
6. A copy of an acceptance letter from either a 2 or 4 year accredited higher educational program, college, or university.
7. A statement of financial need, if applicable.
