<u>Eligibility</u>: To qualify for this scholarship 12th grade students must be attending a High School (Public, Private or Home School) in Prince William County and live in the 22025/22026 zip code. Additionally, Seniors participating in the Montclair Leo Club are also eligible.

<u>Introduction</u>: The Montclair Lions award two different types of scholarships each year, one focused on leadership and academics, and a second focused on service. While these scholarships are similar in content and application process, each application requires its own subject specific essay. This Scholarship, The Montclair Lions Club Scholarships, recognizes a high school senior preparing to pursue higher education who has excelled in leadership and academic achievement. The actual scholarship amount can vary based on funds raised during the year of award, but generally averages \$1000 per scholarship.

All applications must be submitted by Electronic (Digital) filing by 1 April 2024 to montclairlion246@gmail.com, and must be reviewed by the student's parent or guidance counselor for accuracy.

Selection Criteria: Scholarship(s) will be awarded on the basis of the following criteria:

- Completeness of the application and the level of details provided.
- Demonstrated leadership as well as academic excellences.
- Expressed understanding of why leadership in support of school and community is important to the applicant, and how it has benefited them, their classmates, and their surrounding community at large, presented as a written essay.
- Demonstrated above average academic achievements.
- Demonstrated intent to continue higher learning at a two or four-year accredited high education program, college or university.
- Recognition offered by others on applicants' leadership and commitment to community and self-advancement.
- A statement provided by an adult that the data presented is accurate and true.

In addition, if an applicant feels that financial hardship should be considered, details of the hardship should be provided with the application.

<u>History and Background:</u> This scholarship recognizes leadership and leaning and the application of both to helping others, in keeping with a key objective of Lions, one of the largest service organizations in the world. Lion Clubs worldwide strive to promote good citizenship and take an active interest in leading and supporting the civic, cultural, social, and moral welfare of the local community. Lions achieve this mission by volunteering their time and resources and

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partnering with other organizations to improve health and well-being, strengthen our local community, and support those in need through humanitarian services.

<u>The Application Process:</u> Students must send an "Intent to Apply" E-mail providing their name, the name of their high school or home school, and contact information for themselves and their school counselor. Please E-mail intent to: montclairlion246@gmail.com by 1 March 2024.

Students must then compile and forward their application and all supporting materials by **1 April 2024 to the same Email address.** The application may be a combination of an E-mail and attachments, in MS Word, or PDF format, or a single combined file in either format.

The application must be coordinated with Parents or individual Guidance Counselors and include a signed statement that the data presented is accurate and true.

The scholarship winner (or winners) will be determined by the Montclair Lions Club Scholarship Committee and ranked according to the Selection Criteria presented below. Top applicants may be interviewed by the Committee, if necessary.

Instructions:

- 1) The student must submit their intent to apply by 1 March 2024, and their full and complete application by 1 April 2024, to montclairlion246@gmail.com.
- 2) The student must document their leadership skills and commitment to improving their community by providing a resume/listing of school and community service activities, projects, and events they have led or directly supported. These efforts may be sponsored by their school, church, or the community at large. This resume/listing should describe the activities, the student's roles and responsibilities, approximate time spent participating in each, and the types of services provided. Please include a name and telephone number of a contact person for each activity, if available.
- 3) The student must demonstrate via an original essay, their understanding of why leadership is important in school and community activities, and how it benefits themself, their classmates, and their community. This essay should not be more than 400 words and should discuss; a) the student's motivation for taking on leadership roles, b) why it is important to them and those around them at the High School level, and c) how it might benefit them as well as others later in life.

- 4) The student must show an above average academic record, as validated by a copy of their high school transcripts showing a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4 point scale. Please also include a list of any honors or distinctions received during high school.
- 5) The student must demonstrate plans for continuing their education as verified by at least one letter of acceptance to either a 2 or 4 year accredited higher education program, college, or university.
- 6) The student must provide copies of at least two letters of recommendation, preferably from individuals involved in some aspect of their community service involvement (e.g. faculty/advisor of a school club, community organization or church group). Alternatively, a letter of recommendation could also be from someone who benefited from the student's involvement.
